"On July 14, 2001, in Ottawa, Ontario, Todd and Wade Briscoe rescued Jean Boileau from the basket of a burning hot air balloon as he risked his life to try to get his daughter out of the blaze. The balloon had just landed in a field when a gust of wind lifted it and propelled it towards a power line. The nacelle caught fire on contact with an electric shock of some 20,000 volts, before sliding back down to the ground. Witnessing the scene, Todd and Wade Briscoe ran to the hot air balloon and tried to restrain Mr. Boileau who, leaning in the middle of the flames, was desperately trying to reach his daughter at the bottom of the basket. Despite the propane tanks exploding under the intensity of the flames, the Briscoe brothers succeeded, on their fourth attempt, in grabbing Mr. Boileau by his clothes and pulling him and his passenger out of the blaze. Todd and Wade Briscoe escaped unharmed, while Mr. Boileau suffered severe burns to his face, arms, and legs; Unfortunately, her daughter did not survive this tragedy."

Dennis decided to get those close to the woman together in one room, and she credits Kirstin Lund, a trained mediator who had worked in conflict resolution, with working out how they would support the woman in coming up with a plan to help her feel safe.

A Circle of Safety and Support brings a woman worried about her safety because of family violence together with service providers and other supportive people. Together they develop a detailed plan for her safety and support. A trained Circle facilitator leads the preparation and meetings of the Circle.





The choir offers youth on the autism spectrum an early intervention by connecting them with likeminded people and empathetic mentors, helping them realize that they are not alone in their journey. She was 23 years old when she did this.

Organization Gagne-Bergeron Helps People in Need Awarded: 03 May 2021

Born in the Saint-Sauveur district of Quebec City, a former hockey player at the various levels in Quebec to a professional player in Europe, Alain Rioux has developed a team player mentality to the point of wanting to fade in front of the honours to leave all the room for others. However, his commitments over the years in various causes have led him, over the past 10 years, to ensure that the Organization of Pro-Am Gagné-Bergeron achieves its objectives to help people in need. This year, for the tenth presentation of the friendly game between professional players from the National Hockey League and fans from the region, the Pro-Am Gagné-Bergeron took place in the amphitheatre of the Videotron Centre where \$428,000. \$ was raised for the five beneficiary organizations: Pignon Bleu, Leucan, Philippe Boucher Foundation, Maurice Tanguay Foundation and Simple Plan Foundation. In 10 years, some \$1.5 million has been raised. Captain and volunteer. It was also an opportunity for Patrice Bergeron and Simon Gagné to highlight the commitment of this volunteer at the head of the organization of the event. Present during the interview, Simon Gagné recalled the importance of having a good captain to lead the team as Alain Rioux has done over the years. The idea for the hockey game came from two organizers of Simon Gagné's golf tournament. Initially to set the idea in motion, there was Pierre Gagné, Simon's father, and Jos Faucher. Pierre Gagné asked Alain Rioux and his cousin Claude Rioux to also work on starting the project.

When Pierre Gagné died four years ago, someone was needed to continue the work as a team leader. "Alain was in the best position to replace my father," says Simon Gagné. He amazed everyone, so the Pro-Am was able to continue and improve year after year." Moreover, shortly before his death, Pierre Gagné had made Alain Rioux promise to continue the work they had set up with four people. He told her: continue the mission! "He was close to death, but he was thinking about the mission," adds Mr. Rioux. I learned a lot with Pierre. Especially not to be embarrassed to ask people" to contribute and participate. Today, the volunteer team includes about twenty people for the various components of the past event from the L'Ancienne-Lorette sports complex to the Videotron Centre.

In 1999 Dell Marie Wergeland went to Honduras to help victims of Hurricane Mitch. The powerful winds and drenching rain had created landslides that killed thousands and left millions injured and homeless. Dell, a nurse by training, took along medical supplies, tools and school materials.

In the aftermath of the destruction, the aid that arrived was chaotic. Clothing suitable for northern winters would show up, but not the much-needed bandages, needles or medicines. Dell was deeply disturbed by the lack of practical supplies that could have helped wounded and homeless people. She returned to Victoria determined to do something about it.

Under the umbrella of the Church of the Nazarene and with family support, she decided to send a 40-foot container full of goods that would actually fit local needs (a container holds the equivalent of a fully stuffed single-car garage with a nine-foot ceiling). It took her 18 months to send the first container, all the while learning about finding donations of goods and cash, recruiting volunteers, locating responsible agencies to use and distribute goods, dealing with shipping companies, preparing export manifests and satisfying ever-changing customs regulations. There is no "dummies" handbook to teach these things.

Since that slow and humble beginning, more than 525 such containers filled with donated supplies have now arrived in 60+ countries ranging from Ukraine to Malawi to the Philippines. These goods have helped those less fortunate to receive medical care, a toy, some decent clothing, or equipment and tools that will allow them to earn a living.
